### 2024 Asian Law Schools Association (ALSA) Young Scholars Conference

We are delighted to announce that the Asian Law Schools Association (ALSA) Young Scholars Conference, organized by the ALSA Young Scholars Chapter in collaboration with Singapore Management University, the Australian National University, and Thammasat University, will be held at Singapore Management University on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> July 2024.

The conference will provide a unique opportunity for young scholars to present their research. It will also serve as a platform for meeting, interacting with and learning from other colleagues from many law schools from Asia and beyond. The conference will be open to young researchers (that is, doctoral students, assistant professors and associate professors with less than 15 years of experience in academia) in all areas of law, including business and financial laws, constitutional and administrative law, international economic law, law and technology, law and sustainability, private law, civil procedure, courts and alternative dispute resolution, and conflicts of laws. Articles to be presented at the conference may include any methodology used for the study of law, including law and economics, law and society, comparative law, doctrinal analysis, and empirical studies.

- Corporate law
- Financial and cyber crimes
- Law and technology, data privacy and intellectual property
